

This year we did not survey the school community at large. In lieu of a survey, we engaged our school council. At our March 12th School Council meeting, parents provided feedback and questions regarding the school's budget priorities and school development planning for next year. The following points were discussed:

- A parent asked whether the new math resources would meaningfully improve students' math fluency, while another parent inquired about whether additional CCT provincial funding would help offset school costs. It was noted that some funding is expected in the spring with the funding continuing in the fall.

- Parents indicated that information and opportunities for feedback had been communicated through School Council, School Messenger, and the school website.

- Positive feedback was shared regarding student growth in mathematics, with a parent noting noticeable improvements in students' proficiency and mental math fluency compared to previous experiences.

- Parents also expressed support for the school's current priorities in literacy and numeracy, including targeted supports identified through focused intervention with specific student groups.

- Suggestions for future planning included investigating swimming lessons, encouraging more community play opportunities at the park, teaching practical skills such as skipping, incorporating multicultural experiences, and exploring an artist-in-residency program.

We appreciated the conversation and feedback provided by our school council and we look forward to taking some of these conversation points and implementing them next year.
